CALL TO WORSHIP

SCRIPTURE READING

Luke 11:1-13

11 He was praying in a certain place, and after he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, ‘Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples.’² He said to them, ‘When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come.³ Give us each day our daily bread.⁴ And forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone indebted to us. And do not bring us to the time of trial.’⁵ And he said to them, ‘Suppose one of you has a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say to him, “Friend, lend me three loaves of bread;⁶ for a friend of mine has arrived, and I have nothing to set before him.”⁷ And he answers from within, “Do not bother me; the door has already been locked, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot get up and give you anything.”⁸ I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, at least because of his persistence he will get up and give him whatever he needs.⁹ So I say to you, Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you.¹⁰ For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened.¹¹ Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for a fish, will give a snake instead of a fish?¹² Or if the child asks for an egg, will give a scorpion?¹³ If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!’

Kyle Montgomery, Hong Tran, Lisa Montgomery and Beth Augustine went to El Salvador to work in a pop-up medical clinic. We were joined by 18 other Christians from all across America, who went to serve with what gifts we had to give. We were met by the church pastor, Carlos, at the airport from Oasis church - who was full of energy and beaming with love. They gave us translators from their high school so that we were able to communicate and pray with the patients, who were grateful for the free care and free medications. Beth worked in triage taking medical histories, blood pressures, temperatures, and weights. Lisa worked in the pharmacy filling and distributing medications we had brought from the United States and some from El Salvador itself.

The people of El Salvador are so beautiful, especially the little kids with long eyelashes and big smiles. God gave us a busy but meaningful week as we were able to see and care for over 1000 people. We were provided with good food to eat such as tropical fruits and pupusas and were given good accommodations (including air conditioning!) The patients were so friendly and open with the details of their lives, sometimes living in squalor with shacks of tin roofs and dirt floors, with no electricity, and only well water that is carried by jars to their homes.

We hope to go again next year to serve those in dire need, by demonstrating God's love (and some medical aid). Thank you for your support and prayers for us, and for helping us to care for our sisters and brothers in El Salvador.
